

Introduction

From Theory to Practice

Faro Convention





The Faro Convention, officially called the Council of Europe Framework Convention on the Value of Cultural Heritage for Society (signed in Faro, Portugal, in 2005), is a treaty that redefines how we think about cultural heritage.

Faro Convention



- Focuses on the value of heritage for society.
- Puts people at the center: heritage exists because we give it meaning.
- Emphasizes
 - **rights** (Links cultural heritage to human rights & democracy)
 - access (community well-being)
 - o participation,
 - and shared responsibility.

Key Principles of the Faro Convention Applied:

1. Community-Centered Heritage

Documenting personal oral histories, valuing people's experiences as heritage.

2. Participation & Shared Responsibility

Engaging local communities in preserving and shaping their stories.

3. Accessibility & Sustainability

 Ensuring stories are preserved and accessible through digital platforms for future generations.

Impact:

• - Highlights oral history as heritage, contributing to social cohesion and intergenerational dialogue.

Relevance of Oral History

- Cultural heritage institutions often receive requests from local and regional oral history initiatives for support in preserving, registering, and presenting their interviews.
- Oral history and Digital Heritage are two key themes in the Faro-Implementation Agenda
- Oral history interviews are a great way to collect and share diverse stories and perspectives on both tangible and intangible heritage.
- Oral history is both a participatory method and a source of unique heritage stories, offering valuable historical insights when properly preserved and accessed.



Past Initiatives using Oral History



The "Hidden Stories" project, submitted with Stichting OPEN and Network Digital Heritage, seeks to establish support for local and regional oral history initiatives, helping them transcribe, preserve, and present interviews with minimal assistance. The project's goal is to collaborate with key stakeholders in oral history, digitization, and heritage to create a practical provincial support structure. This structure will empower local and regional oral history initiatives to independently preserve, register, and present their interview collections with minimal support.






Conclusion
